

Church-State Rally

A t noon on Friday, June 8, Catholics staged demonstrations across the country to publicize the objection by bishops to contraceptive coverage in the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010. The bill required employer-subsidized health care insurance to provide full coverage for contraceptives. Catholic churches were exempted from the rule, but they objected that



the requirement applied to corporations such as universities and hospitals that the church operates. Several states previously had enacted this requirement, and the church-run companies complied, showing that their moral convictions on the matter cannot have been inviolable.

Nevertheless, the Obama administration made a major change to the rule to accommodate the Catholic objections. No requirement to pay for contraceptive coverage would be placed upon any business run by the church, but it must be provided and paid for by the insurance company. This is not regarded as a grab into the profits of the insurance companies, because the reduction in costs for pregnancies is expected to be sufficient to cover it.

Catholic bishops objected that this was a ruse, and that insurance companies were certain to pass the costs back to them at the first rate adjustment. It might very well be reasonable for them to insist upon regulations to ensure that insurers cannot do this.

Instead, the bishops have just become ever more intractable in their opposition to any contraceptive coverage requirement. Some argue not only that an exemption should be provided to organized religions, but that **any** employer

should be allowed to set aside **any** coverage requirement to which they morally object! This would permit a Christian Scientist to provide coverage only for prayer!

In Minnesota, two Catholic organizations, the Pro-Life Action League and Citizens for a Pro-Life Society, organized a demonstration at the Federal Courthouse in downtown Minneapolis. We only found out about it two days before, when we received a broadcast e-mail warning from Stuart Bechman of American Atheists. We announced a counter-demonstration on Meetup, and I picked up a few signs for people to hold. About a dozen atheists showed up, nearly half of whom brought their own hand-made signs.

Every one of us encountered Catholic demonstrators who wanted to confront us and argue politics and religion. Some of these discussions immediately turned into shouting matches. Certainly the intent of many aggressive Catholics was to intimidate us. One with an incredibly booming voice stood amongst us, cheering



the speakers loudly that it was impossible to hear even the Catholics who were trying to argue with us. I had no intention of engaging debates, since I had learned years ago that an individual cannot argue when outnumbered opponents who are pelting him with questions all at

once. When a single individual approached me, however, I did engage in conversation. Despite my every intent, I could not avoid at one point raising my voice in response to one of his questions, as the hostility at the event was so irresistible.

I did not see any reporters or photographers from the newspapers or broadcast media in attendance, and I

Board Adopts a New Anti-Harassment Policy

E veryone is looking forward to the Regional Conference that we are co-sponsoring with American Atheists in St. Paul on August 11. It prompted one of our members to write to our board on a very serious matter, however. She noted that it is becoming standard for atheist and skeptic organizations to adopt anti-harassment policies for their conventions. This is a direct consequence of several incidents that were widely discussed in popular blogs, in which female participants complained of sexual harassment. It is not clear if these incidents are on the rise or if conference organizers are merely becoming more sensitized to them.

The member provided a link to a web site with models for a conference anti-harassment policy. These models were designed specifically for conferences, and American Atheists was already drafting a policy for our joint event, which our board would review. It pointed up a need, though, for a Minnesota Atheist policy to state the board's position regarding harassing conduct by members at any event we sponsor. To this end, the board adopted the following policy at our June meeting.

Minnesota Atheists is dedicated to ensuring a harassment-free membership experience at all of its events for everyone, regardless of gender, gender expression, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, body size, race, national extraction or ethnicity. We do not tolerate harassment in any form. Sexual language and imagery is not appropriate for any event we sponsor. The Board of Directors may impose sanctions in accordance with the Bylaws on members who violate these rules, including expulsion.

Harassment includes offensive verbal comments related to gender, gender expression, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, body size, race, national extraction or ethnicity; sexual images in public spaces, deliberate intimidation, stalking, following, harassing photography or recording, sustained disruption of talks or other events, inappropriate physical contact, and unwelcome sexual attention. Members asked to stop any harassing behavior are expected to comply immediately.

We ask our members to familiarize themselves with this policy, and to comply with it.


The Radio Fund Needs Your Help!
